International Journal on Innovations in Online Education (IJIOE)

IJIOE has been publishing for four years, and currently publishes four issues a year. The principal aim of IJIOE is to provide the field of online higher education with quality knowledge about what is going on in important areas of the field, with a specific emphasis on what is new and likely to affect the field. The journal publishes critical and timely articles in various aspects of contemporary online education. These articles constitute the major part of any given issue. It is hoped that the articles will provide a critical analysis rather than a passive account of information in a given topic. IJIOE is looking for 5,000 to 6,000 word manuscripts for upcoming issues on:

1. The **development of innovations learned from the COVID-19 online transition and sustaining of online teaching practices**. There is a need to help educators understand the how the transition to online learning can be sustained in ways that support teacher and student well-being, as well as maintain required learning outcomes.
2. **Continuity of service** as a key item for colleges and schools in their disaster planning. Questions in the area could be: How to best use OL to bring success; Research-informed practices on service continuity in post-secondary education during disasters.
3. **Area of VR Assessment** - The use of live actors to bring contextual learning is now realized and should be surfaced in the journal articles. Focus on the adoption of augmented reality, it's not only coming, but here in education.
4. **The context of global online education is now a reality for all education stakeholders**. The opportunity to showcase case studies at a global perspective is not only relevant but necessary in a connected world.
5. **Relevant innovations in supporting online teaching and learning in a post-COVID-19 context**.

The key focus of IJIOE is on innovation in online education and manuscripts are to address innovation in the writing. Review criteria includes:

- a. Relevance to the theme of the journal;
- b. Clarity and accessibility of writing style;
- c. Innovation of approach, research, practice-based model, and relevance in Online Education;
- d. Relevant use of literature (i.e., appropriateness of references);
- e. Relevance of methodology, techniques used, or modes of inquiry (may not apply for all innovations);
- f. Overall scholarship and quality of the submission;

This is an open (i.e., rolling) call for papers.
